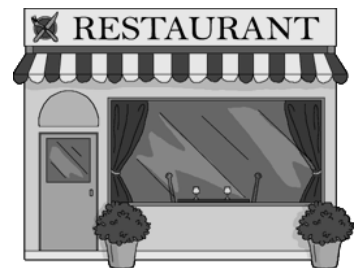

<p><b>7 – 8</b></p> <p><b>Good</b></p>	<p>Communicates the information needed. Few mistakes of grammar, lexis, spelling or punctuation.</p>
<p><b>5 – 6</b></p> <p><b>Pass</b></p>	<p>Communicates most of the information needed. Quite a few mistakes, but it is possible to understand the writing.</p>
<p><b>3 – 4</b></p> <p><b>Weak</b></p>	<p>A lot of information is not communicated and mistakes make it difficult to understand the writing.</p>
<p><b>1 – 2</b></p> <p><b>Very weak</b></p>	<p>Has communicated very little.</p>
